

This form can be used to record and assess hazards in advance of a field trip to a country with a worse security situation than in Germany, according to the Federal Foreign Office (<u>https://www.auswaertiges-amt.de/de/ReiseUndSicherheit/reise-und-sicherheitshinweise</u>), as well as to document the protective measures required for this purpose.

The risk assessment is to be prepared by the responsible field trip leader and be submitted to the coordinating office for documentation

Note concerning the assessment of security situation in foreign countries:

In the case of field trip trips abroad, it must be clarified, whether the destination is located in an area or country with an increased risk (worse security situation in the country than in Germany, see **Federal Foreign Office, Travel and safety instructions**: https://www.auswaertigesamt.de/de/ReiseUndSicherheit/reise-und-sicherheitshinweise or the comparable classification of the poorer security situation of the countries under the BMEIA travel warning BMEIA travel warning, from security level 2 https://www.bmeia.gv.at/reise-services/reisewarnungen//).

a) If the travel destination is located in an area or country without increased risk (*security situation of the country is comparably good as in Germany*) this supplementary risk assessment is not mandatory.

b) If the destination is located in an area or country with an increased risk (the security situation of the country is worse than in Germany), in **addition to** the business travel authorization, the consideration and evaluation of the security situation in the destination country is required before the field trip.

To this end, this risk assessment tool is used to systematically deal with the usual safety aspects of business trips abroad. However, the working aid cannot claim to be complete, as individual cases (e.g. in the case of expeditions to the Antarctic) may require further special safety aspects to be considered.
